From Muckross to Melbourne

Muckross Park was the only school I ever attended. I started in what was then called 'Reception' in 1967 when I was 4 years old and my first teacher was my beloved late 'adoptive auntie' Sister Alexis. My best friends in the junior school, with whom I made my first communion were Helen Martin and Avril Kearns who had the most glamorous older sisters Muriel, Sonia and Joyce, whom we desperately tried to emulate! I remember wonderful teachers like Mrs Trimble, Miss McCarthy and Miss McAllister. I continued on to the secondary school where my favourite teachers were Sister Barnabas, Miss O'Donoghue and Miss O'Sullivan who introduced me to my lifelong love of the German language.

After my Leaving Certificate in 1981 I went to UCD where I did a B.A. (Hons) in German and French and I was lucky enough to win a full scholarship in 1983 to spend a year at the University of Bonn, the then capital of Germany. After graduating in 1985 I worked for a brief period at Bórd Fáilte as a Tourist Advisor and then as a graduate trainee at TCD's Dental Faculty Library. While I was doing my postgraduate Diploma in Information Studies at UCD I was recruited on the old university 'milk round' by Bain & Co. and moved to London to take up a position with them. I had a wonderful time at Bain. The 1980s in London really were years of 'wine and roses'; I remember the Bain Christmas Ball at the Dorchester Hotel in Park Lane and Summer Ball at Foxhills Country Club in Surrey. I met my husband Damian, an Australian architect, at my first Bain Christmas Ball in December 1988. We married and had our first son, Claude, in London and moved to Australia in late 1991. Our second son, Kim, was born here in Melbourne in 1994. My husband has had his own architectural practice for over 10 years and I am currently a Recruitment Director at the Australian Taxation Office. Claude is studying for his Masters in Logistics and working full-time as a Logistics Analyst and Kim is in his second year of university studying journalism.

I love living in Australia, the sunny weather, the wide open spaces and the beautiful landscapes, and Melbourne is a very culturally vibrant city with a lively theatre and arts scene. Damian and I enjoy entertaining, hosting dinner parties, and travelling. We have been to Japan, China, New Zealand and the US, most recently to Los Angeles for our nephew's wedding where we tagged on a road trip up the Pacific coast to San Francisco.

I mentioned above that I was a Tourist Advisor with Bórd Fáilte briefly, in the O'Connell Street Tourist Office and in those days (1986) we had a beautiful navy lambswool uniform suit designed by Paul Costelloe, who also designed many of Princess Diana's clothes. This suit was worn with a crisp white linen blouse and a scarf with shamrocks and 'Discover Ireland' on it. I was at a vintage fashion show in Melbourne

earlier this year and the compère, a textiles professor from RMIT University, announced that there would be outfits by Vivienne Westwood, Louis Féraud...and Paul Costelloe! At which point I just had to put my hand up and ask if I could please see the Paul Costelloe as I had once worn a uniform suit by him... and would you believe the very uniform suit was immediately trotted out! I was speechless. Everyone asked me to try it on but sadly only the jacket fitted me! It has been a year of 'full circle' experiences, with 'my old Bórd Fáilte uniform' following me Down Under and Damian and myself being invited this month to the Global Bain Alumni 40th Anniversary cocktail party, to which we will be bringing our old Bain picture book from 1988!




CAPE TOWN UPDATE

In early March last year we heard the sad news that Sr Áine Hardiman had died. Sr Áine along with Sr Caitriona have been running the various Dominican Early Learning Playschool Projects in Cape Town and the PPU, through its Benevolent Fund, have been delighted to support their endeavours for the past few years.

Sr Áine, a young nun in her mid-20s, arrived in Cape Town we believe in the early 1950s. She eventually became principal of a highly regarded Dominican school for white children but in time she became more involved with the children of the African townships. She was active against the injustices of apartheid during the 1980s. Sr Áine, along with other Dominican sisters, was arrested when they walked in the 'Free Mandela' march in Cape Town and spent a week in prison before being released.

She was instrumental in the development of Early Learning Centres, the first being in Nyanga Township. Since then many more of these Playschool centres have been established under her guidance and are now being run independently by the local women.

The following is an excerpt from an email from Sr Caitriona we received on 8th May 2013.

I really did not have the heart to write and thank you for the 2013 Muckross Mail newsletter until now. Our dear Sr Áine died after a very short illness. We were still mourning her sudden passing as well as thanking God for her wonderful gifts, when your newsletter arrived in March. May she rest in peace.

Áine has left behind a wonderful legacy of lives touched by her care and compassion.

Among other things, she has been fully involved in community development especially in encouraging young mothers to take an active part in setting up little Early Childhood Education playgroups in their backyards or on any little piece of land that they could 'grab'! The story is well told in your publication *A Century of Memories*. And the marvellous thing is that the Muckross Past Pupils have been so active over the years in supporting this project.

In December 2012 we acknowledged the very generous donation of €500 received from the Muckross Past Pupils' Union. I would like you to know that this money helped to sustain the Masizame Playgroup in the township of Nyanga for the year 2013.

Please convey my sincere thanks, on behalf of Áine and myself, to the Muckross Past Pupils' Union for their support over the years in helping to supply the Project at various times with food for the children, support for the women running the Playgroups, educational equipment and structures (converted shipping containers) to use as classrooms.


PPU v School Hockey Match

We reported in our 2011 issue that there had been plans to convert the old senior school and concert hall wing into a multicultural centre in co-operation with Dublin City Council but this fell through due to the recession. We gather the space will be developed as a garden beside the chapel. It is sad to see it go but we hear that it was not viable to renovate to modern health and safety standards. However we are delighted to report that the lovely parquet floor was salvaged first.

The part of the building that contained the former senior school has been converted into 12 apartments for nuns of the Dominican Order.

THE CONCERT HALL REMEMBERED

"The roar of the greasepaint, the smell of the crowd"; "Break a leg"; "The show must go on"; "It'll be alright on the night". All these crazy clichés went through my head as I sat in the concert hall in Muckross Park College for the last time. I was attending the Carol Concert of the Muckross girls just before Christmas in 2005 as the school prepared to move into a new building in February '06.

I may have been listening to the sopranos and altos singing their hearts out but my mind was hurtling back to my own days in Muckross and in particular to times spent in this very hall. Backstage throbbed with excitement as we took our places behind heavy curtains which would shudder open and we would be emblazoned in light and would squint to see familiar faces in the crowd. This was the hall where Miss Cranny strutted, roaring or whispering the lines we were to repeat. My earliest memories, in Muckross junior school, are of pieces from Edward Lear and Lewis Carroll those great professors of Nonsense:

"You are old Father William" the young man said
"And your hair has become very white.
And yet you incessantly stand on your head –
Do you think at your age it is right?"

As we pranced around in Alice-in-Wonderland costumes we were told to 'use the whole stage' and 'don't mumble into your costume'. But there were other performances too, with tea-towel clad shepherds and tin-foil dressed kings. Nativity plays and Santa's arrival at the Christmas sale-of-work meld together as one, big pantomime.

The senior school brought several opening nights. The major one for us was "Murder in the Cathedral" by T.S. Eliot under the direction of Sr. Patrick, in 1970. This took weeks of practice so that the choral lines are embedded in my memory:

"Seven years and the summer is over;
Seven years since the Archbishop left us.
He who was always kind to his people.
But it would not be good should he return."

Not only was the stage used but all the steps in front of it too, for the members of the chorus.

Probably most fun was had when we were left to our own devices (without teachers) to script, act, produce and direct a short piece in Irish for the recently-launched "Slogadh" competition. We entered a comedy piece (known to us as a 'skit'), borrowed nuns' habits, fathers' suits and mothers' evening dresses and lo and behold, won the Section!

The Aer Lingus debating competition in English and the Gaelinn competition in Irish also used the hall. Miss Kinsella would reign supreme as we opened our debates by addressing her as "Madam Chairman". It was nerve-wrecking to stand on that stage and argue for or against the motion, but it certainly prepared you for any future public speaking occasions.

I know every inch of this concert hall (which existed long before The National Concert Hall); the squared pattern in the ceiling, the crest on the balcony, the parquet wooden floor, the black-out velvet curtains. Since my time in Muckross, the paintwork has been renewed, the colour of the curtains changed, the floor re-sanded and polished, but it remains essentially the same to me, a treasure chest of challenges and accomplishments, a buzz of audience applause, a resonance of warm voices and music where a young girl could *pretend* to be a star, even if only for one night.

As rumours bubble under the surface that Muckross students may stage a play or musical in this academic year of '07 / '08 I hope that the new school hall will have the power of the old concert hall to infuse schoolgirls' performances with the magic of stardom.

Hibernia is the only Latin name in that group and is apparently a long-standing table quiz question, 'what is the Latin name for Ireland'? So if I learned nothing else during my time in Muckross at least I learned that! Oh and that the Dominican motto 'Veritas' means truth.

Sr. Norah was our formidable Principal during my time, a lady who was 'firm, but fair' and had a heart of gold. I have bumped into her many times since I left school, and we have had wonderful chats. Sr. Norah, a great Feminist was ahead of her time with her 'girl power' encouragement of her students.

My personal memories of my time in the school are the long bus journeys for me each day from Monkstown to Donnybrook and it was something I dreaded; but my association with the 46a bus route has stood me in good stead from travelling to Muckross, later to UCD and next stop... RTÉ, via a stint with AA Roadwatch.

It is to Transition Year that I owe a lot of my later confidence and success. It was a time that allowed me to blossom and pursue my love of acting and performance in 'Philadelphia Here I Come', and later in 'The Shaughraun' with the boys from Gonzaga. Believe me presenting on live TV isn't as nerve wrecking as taking to the stage in front of your peers. Credit must be given to the late Ms Geraldine Brennan and Ms Deirdre MacMathuna for encouraging me in my pursuit of drama.

No mention of my school days can be complete without reference to the friends I made, and I had a close-knit group of four pals. As

is so natural, the ones I thought might last fizzled, but new ones have surfaced. Back in 2007 when I took part in RTÉ's 'Charity You're a Star', (which will have amazed many I'd imagine, as I failed my school audition for the special choir!) I was delighted that so many of my former classmates came out to support me. Shelly McClafferty was brilliant for rounding up the troops to help me with my efforts to raise funds and awareness for 'The Alzheimer's Association'.



After that shocking photograph in the 'Irish Times' just before Christmas of a digger breaking apart the old school, I walked nervously into the grounds recently. I was worried I might be upset at the sight of the school, but actually to my surprise the whole place looked better than ever. The new school is neatly tucked in a corner, the old house/convent takes pride of place in the centre of the complex, and the Chapel stands out in all its glory with its beautiful stained glass windows.

I saw on Facebook recently that Sr. Barnabas celebrated her 97th birthday.

I'm delighted to hear that she is in such good health and spirits, and I guess it just goes to prove the point that Muckross must be doing something right, and to that I will raise a glass at our forthcoming milestone reunion in the Spring - see you there ladies!



As the costs involved with the trip were very high, I had to do something to raise money for my team from the Dwarf Sports Association of Ireland and myself to travel. In order to do this I trained very hard so I could swim a sponsored 1km non-stop in my local swimming pool at Enable Ireland, Sandymount. They were very supportive of me and allowed me the whole pool to myself one Friday afternoon so I could do my 1km swim. Many of my classmates and teachers came to watch me and sponsored me with generous amounts to aid my funds to travel to Michigan. Two members of the PPU committee were also there and I would like to thank them for their support and generosity.

So finally, the day arrived in July for me to travel to Michigan, along with my team and family, to participate in the World Dwarf Games. Not only did I win three golds and a silver medal in swimming but I also beat my personal record for the 100m backstroke from the previous Games in 2009.



Imagine my excitement when I was asked early last June if I would like to play in Wimbledon!

My Club, Glasnevin LTC, was invited to send a team of 4 players – 2 ladies and 2 men – to play in Wimbledon's Centenary Clubs Tournament on Thursday 8th August 2013. The day, sunny and hot, started at 11 a.m. with meet and greet and morning coffee in the Rolex Suite. There were 5 teams from other clubs in England and Wales as well as a team from Wimbledon. We were then taken on a tour of the grounds and player areas. The ladies were assigned to the changing rooms reserved for the top 16 seeds during the Championships, complete with wicker chairs, louvered doors, sun creams, baths and showers and two attendants who later ran a bath for those requesting it!

After lunch, decked out in the essential all-whites we made our way to the Clubhouse in which the trophies are on display. One side leads out to the courts on which we were playing and on the other side to Centre Court through the door which has the famous Rudyard Kipling quote 'if you can meet with triumph

and disaster and treat those two imposters just the same'. We had a warm-up session with the Wimbledon Head Coach, Dan Bloxham, who put us through our paces with great fun. The format for the tennis was mixed doubles. My partner and I were scheduled for Courts 5 and 6 just behind Centre Court. We played for about 3 hours. It was the most fantastic feeling to be actually playing on the hallowed grass!

A pre-dinner reception for all was held in the Royal Box. Dinner in the Members' Dining Room in the Clubhouse was followed by after dinner speeches and presentations. At my table we were entertained by Wimbledon members and committee who told stories and anecdotes about the famous players, like Djokovic, Federer, Nadal, Bartoli, Roddick, Navratilova, who have played in Wimbledon over the years.

Reluctantly we left the Wimbledon at about 11 p.m. after an amazing day. I found myself almost having to pinch myself to see was it really happening. It was a great honour and privilege to have been selected to play and the memories of 'when I played in Wimbledon' will always be special.

On The Santa Party




At the Muckross Santa Party were Nina Braswell and Rachel Smyth with Santa's helper Claire Gately.
